The Citizen's Advisory Committee meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. Members present from left to right: Felton Barnes, Roy Estes, De'Carlo Garcia, and Ray Nelson.

1. Called to Order

President De'Carlo Garcia called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

2. Pledge of Allegiance

The attendees present recited the Pledge.

3. Approval of the Agenda

Mr. Estes made a motion to approve the agenda during the meeting, and Mr. Nelson seconded the motion.

4. Action Items

4.1 Approval of April 9, 2024, minutes- Mr. Estes made a motion to approve the April minutes, seconded by Mr. Barnes.

4.2 Main Street Maintenance- Mr. Garcia has been approached by shop owners and has noticed the negativity on social media regarding the main street redevelopment plan. He is inquiring about other ways that citizens or the CAC can help spread the word that the businesses on Main Street are still open.

Action: After extensive discussion, Mayor Pro Tem Capps interrupted the meeting to emphasize that the city has posted notices in the bulletin, on social media, and on signs throughout the area. Local businesses have even created videos to convey that Main Street is still open. It's ultimately up to the community to decide whether they want to park behind the stores to support these businesses. Mr. Estes said that we should continue to emphasize that Main Street is still open.

Additionally, Mr. Estes noted the progress being made behind the scenes on roads that are not yet open to the public and how everything will come together upon completion.

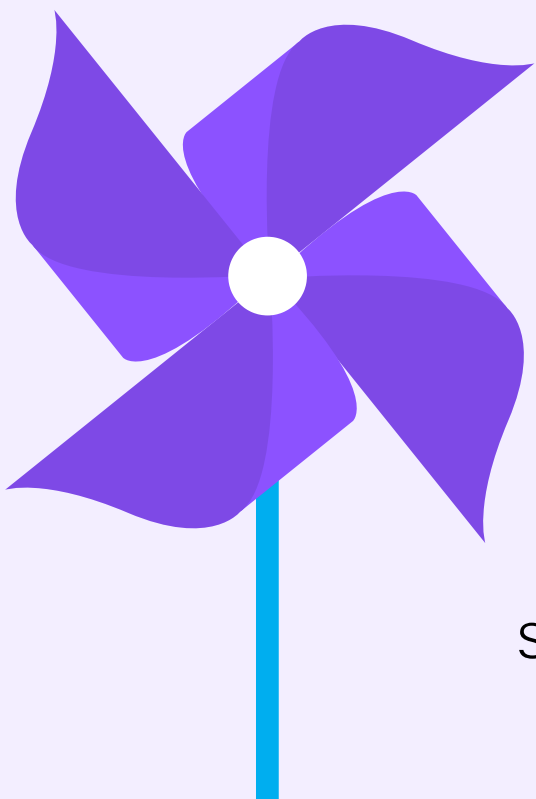
