Each board, commission, or agency of this state or of any political subdivision thereof shall include in the notice of any meeting or hearing, if notice of the meeting or hearing is required, of such board, commission, or agency, conspicuously on such notice, the advice that, if a person decides to appeal any decision made by the board, agency, or commission with respect to any matter considered at such meeting or hearing, he or she will need a record of the proceedings, and that, for such purpose, he or she may need to ensure that a verbatim record of the proceedings is made, which record includes the testimony and evidence upon which the appeal is to be based. The requirements of this section do not apply to the notice provided in s. 200.065(3). SUBJECT: Resolution 2025 - 20, Adopting the FY25/26 Final Millage Rate

BACKGROUND:

Within fifteen (15) days after the tentative millage hearing, the City must advertise its intent to adopt a final millage. The public hearing to adopt the final millage must be two to five days after the advertisement appears in the paper as required by Florida Statute 200.065(2).

DISCUSSION:

The tentative millage rate of 6.6466 was adopted by Resolution 2025-17 at the Tentative Millage Hearing on September 15, 2025. The advertisement, as required by Florida Statute 200.065(2), was in the NW Florida Daily News on September 19, 2025.

The following announcements are as required by Florida Statute 200.065(5):

Taxing Authority - City of Crestview 6.6225 is the current rollback rate.
6.6466 is the proposed operating millage rate and is a .36 percentage increase over the rolled-back rate.
Final Millage rate to be levied is 6.6466.

WHEREAS, The City of Crestview of Okaloosa County, Florida on September 22, 2025 held a public hearing as required by Florida Statute 200.065;

WHEREAS, The City of Crestview of Okaloosa County, Florida, set forth the appropriations and revenue estimate for the Budget for Fiscal Year 2026 in the amount of \$81,206,821; and;
